## Scenario 1: Jenny

lan's 5 year old daughter Jenny is in her final stages of cancer. He requests that she spend her final moments in his arms of which the nurses agree. She is placed in his arms. lan arrives at the hospital and is ushered to the room where his beautiful sister has been placed. He throws himself onto the seat next to the bed with his head in his hands crying out her name. The door quietly opens and he tentatively encroaches into their space. Ian looks up and his expression turns from hurt to rage. The unwanted visitor is his father, but then Ian already knew that without having to look up. He recognised the way the door was opened. It was the same manner that he heard night after night as he entered his daughter's room under the cover of darkness.
